Practice feedback.

The Thorner practicewill be expanded and the rooms used to facilitate more appointments for the Collingham practice, this will include physiotherapy and midwife clinics.

The last full CQC inspection was in 2019. the CQC now does remote monitoring and only does full inspection if there are deemed to be any problems.

Certain conditions can be seen by the pharmacist in the village pharmacy, where possible, patients will be directed to the practice via the triage systems, but patients can do a walk in. Feedback to the practice is via pharma outcome software. Other pharmacies in the area include Day Lewis pharmacies in Boston Spa and Wetherby and Boots pharmacy in Wetherby.

The new Triage system seems to be working very well with most appointments being done electronically. The online form is only available until 1300 hours, where after, if urgent, patients can contact the receptionists, who fill in an online form and triage will then take place to direct the patients to the appropriate appointment. Dr Trigg has indicated that the appointments now are of a more complex nature as more less serious appointments can be dealt with either over the telephone or by referring to the appropriate practitioner or pharmacy

As there are four potential new members, no further new members will be required at present. The advertisement on the notice board will be changed appropriately. Futher questionnaires have been handed in, and the Secretary will collate them with the previous work done by a member. A suggestion was made to see whether the PPG can be involved in the new Change.NHS.org website and whether this should be publicised on the notice board.
